Secondary Education: List of Approved Majors

- English;
- history (history majors must complete additional course work in political science and one of the following: sociology, psychology, economics);
- mathematics;
- political science (political science majors must complete additional course work in history and one of the following: sociology, psychology, economics);
- science (science majors must complete licensing requirements in one of the following areas: chemistry, life science);
- Spanish.
