Advanced Writing Proficiency

The Advanced Writing Proficiency requirement in psychology is designed to foster the development of a wide range of psychological writing skills and styles, including the following:

- the analysis and synthesis of research literature using scientific (i.e., APA style) writing;
- · case study descriptions of child and adult development;
- · report of a scientific research project and structured lab observations;
- · personal reflections on the intersection of theory, research, and person experiences;
- · reasoned position papers using empirical evidence to support the student's argument.

Students complete a designated set of papers to demonstrate competence in various writing skills and proficiency in specific styles of psychological writing.

Senior Comprehensive

Psychology majors may complete one of two types of Senior Comprehensive projects in psychology:

- a. an extensive review of the literature on a psychological topic, or
- b. an empirical research study that the student proposes and conducts independently.

Students present their senior comprehensive projects to the psychology faculty and their peers. Satisfactory completion of the PSYC 495 Senior Seminar in Psychology or PSYC 493 Quantitative Senior Seminar in Psychology and PSYC 494 Quantitative Senior Seminar in Psychology classes, their projects, and presentations, satisfies the senior comprehensive requirement.
